Module Description:

A detailed exploration of the ethical dilemmas facing social workers (Module 1); the identification of ethical "high risk" situations social workers encounter (Module 1), and an examination of the technology-focused recent revisions to NASW's Code of Ethics and the Standards for Technology in Social Work Practice (Module 2).

Substantial time will be devoted to the discussion of scenarios involving the application of NASW Code provisions and other ethical considerations. Students will be encouraged to present their own ethical dilemmas for discussion and analysis (Modules 1 and 2).

Module Objectives:

- 1. Identification of ethical "high risk" areas faced by social workers (Module 1)
- 2. Understanding the recent revisions to NASW's Code of Ethics (Module 2)
- 3. Understanding the Technology Standards adopted by NASW, ASWB, et al. (Module 2)
- 4. Increased ability to apply the NASW Code to practice scenarios (Modules 1 and 2)
