Module Description:

This module will introduce students to the use of literature review as a form of scholarship and as a component of framing a topic of inquiry in social work. Students will be introduced to the purpose of a literature review and review examples of literature reviews in peer-reviewed social work research articles. By the end of the module, students will have conceptualized a topic for the literature review of their case study.
