PROJECT GOALS

- To enhance the work on each of the Rutgers campuses to address sexual and dating violence
- To strengthen a coordinated, university-wide message about the Rutgers response to sexual violence

UNIVERSITY-WIDE ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Rutgers now has three victim services offices open on the Newark, Camden, and New Brunswick campuses
- 94 new clients have been served between the months of October 2017 and January 2018
- Technical assistance has been provided to all three campuses to help them use evidence-informed programs and procedures
