

What trafficking IS

- The Trafficking Victims Protection Act (TVPA) defines trafficking as the recruitment, harboring, transportation, or obtaining of person through the use of force, fraud, or coercion for the purpose of subjection to involuntary servitude, peonage, debt bondage, or slavery.
- Sex trafficking in which a commercial sex act is induced by force, fraud, or coercion, or in which the person induced to perform the act has not attained 18 years of age.

US trafficking victims demographics

- 800,000 people are trafficked across national borders annually
 - Prostitution/Commercial Sex: 23%-66%
 - Exotic dancing/pornography
 - Domestic labor: 7%-45%
 - Personal servitude
 - Factory/sweatshop labor
 - Restaurant labor
 - Agricultural or other labor: 10%-46%
- 55% of trafficking victims are foreign nationals
- 45% of trafficking victims are U.S. citizens





Conclusions

- 'Taken' is a great, suspenseful movie that does not depict trafficking as it actually happens
- Trafficking happens all around us, to people of all walks of life
- Trafficking takes many forms
