



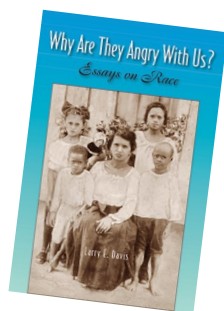

In this lecture, Dr. Davis addresses the country's deep misunderstandings about race, and the core of many commonly held attitudes that contribute to racism in America.

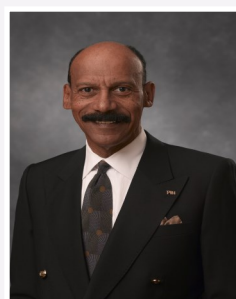

Dr. Davis received his Ph.D. from the University of Michigan's dual degree program in social work and psychology in 1977. He holds a bachelor's degree in psychology from Michigan State University and a master's in social work and a master's in psychology from the University of Michigan.

His professional interests include interracial group dynamics, the impact of race, gender, and class on interpersonal interactions, African American family formation, and youth.
