**Statement of Scholarship**

My research focuses on the characteristics, consequences and treatment of addiction (opioid, gambling) among health disparity and high-risk populations. These include racial and rural minorities, people living at low-income levels, and those with co-occurring disorders. This work aims to address the ongoing epidemic of drug overdoses, and barriers to evidence-based treatment. My goal is to develop knowledge that has an impact on academics, policymakers, practitioners, and the public. To date, I have 43 publications<sup>1</sup> across interdisciplinary outlets. Of those, 25 are in refereed journals, with a majority as first or second author, and 12 including student authors. My scholarship has been translated to news media, academic newsletters, and in community settings. Through my research, I have earned competitive awards and fellowships, and been Principal Investigator, Co-PI, or Co-I on projects supported by federal, state, and internal funding mechanisms. I teach practice courses on addiction treatment, act as a mentor to student researchers, deliver clinical trainings, and provide service for national, community, and university groups.
