**Statement of Scholarship**

My clinical and health services research has a goal to improve knowledge and treatment of addiction for health disparity populations with opioid use disorder (OUD). My research addresses the needs of underserved rural populations, socioeconomically-disadvantaged urban populations, racial minority populations, and publicly insured populations. I have experience leading research and evaluation projects with diverse methods and data analytic approaches involving patient samples, community health data, and quality improvement procedures. Through my scholarship, I have earned awards from NIDA and the Fulbright Program, and been PI, Co-PI, or Co-I on projects supported by SAMHSA, Department of Health and Human Services, and university funds. My papers have been published<sup>1</sup> in interdisciplinary journals and regularly involve student authors. I teach and lead courses on addiction, deliver trainings on addiction treatment to health professionals, and disseminate findings to policymakers and the public. My scholarship is informed by growing up in an NIH-defined rural community with limited access to health care services or economic opportunities.
