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### **Module Description:**

This module will introduce students to how to identify literature through library searches and organize to prepare for a deep analysis of articles collected. Students will become familiar with the key search terms they will use by exploring literature on their individual topic of choice. By the end of the module, students will have collected and pre-organized at least five articles.

### **Module Objectives:**

1. Identify the relevant databases to search for peer-reviewed research.
2. Select and utilize key search terms to locate research relevant to the case study assignment literature review.
3. Obtain at least 5 relevant research articles to synthesize for the literature review with the goal of finding more outside of the classroom.
