Curriculum at a Glance

Advanced Standing, 39 Credits

Students who have attained a BSW from an accredited undergraduate social work program are admitted with advanced standing. Up to 21 credits representing the generalist curriculum are transferred in towards the MSW. Advanced standing students are required to take Clinical Assessment & Diagnosis and 9 credits of Field. Order of courses may change according to the needs of the program and particular cohorts. However, Clinical Assessment and Diagnosis, Clinical Social Work 1 and 2 are always in the designated semester.

- Courses in the Intensive Weekend program are sequential, one course following another.
 There is some overlap between courses.
- Classes meet one weekend a month, Saturday and Sunday, from 9am 5pm. Students prepare online the month preceding class and between class meetings. Preparation includes a synchronous online class, usually held on a Saturday morning each month, as well as asynchronous online Discussions and assignments. Pandemic modifications as determined will be posted.
- Although students are provided with a calendar of class dates at the start of the program, the order of courses may change based on the needs of the program or students.
- Field hours are integrated with academic courses: for advanced standing students, 12 hours/week

The 39 credit Advanced Standing MSW program encompasses two Distribution Requirements and four electives from the categories below. Distribution courses and electives are assigned to each cohort and informed by student interests. The following courses have historically been offered in the Intensive Weekend program:
