

INTENSIVE WEEKEND PROGRAM Curriculum at a Glance

Order of courses may change according to the needs of the program and student, who may take courses with other cohorts, based on course needs. Clinical Assessment and Diagnosis, SWP 1 and 2, and CSW 1 and 2 are always in the designated semester. Accelerated students entering the program with 9 or more credits replace completed courses with electives or other courses for which they have met prereq assignments and have a slightly accelerated field schedule to permit graduation by January of their third year. Required courses that are generally not transferred in are highlighted.

Successful completion of the generalist curriculum and the statistics requirement is required before beginning the specialized curriculum in Spring of Year 2. We encourage students to meet the stats requirement before beginning MSW classes .

- A modestly accelerated field schedule students entering the program with 9 or more graduate credits permits completion of the program in January rather than May of the third year. Courses that have already been taken are substituted by electives or advanced courses for which pre-requisites, if any, have been met.
- Courses in the Intensive Weekend program are sequential, one course following another. There is some overlap between courses.
- Classes meet one weekend a month, Saturday and Sunday, from 9am – 5pm. Students prepare online the month preceding class and between class meetings. Preparation includes a synchronous online class, usually held on a Saturday morning each month, as well as asynchronous online Discussions and assignments. *Pandemic modifications as determined will be posted.*
- Attendance is very important in the program and attendance policies are posted in each course syllabus.
- Although students are provided with a calendar of class dates at the start of the program, the order of courses may change based on the needs of the program or students. Students who have met some of the requirements before beginning the program, may be able to replace by taking a course with another cohort, if available and prerequisites have been met.
- Field hours are integrated with academic courses: 11 hours per week, increasing to 12 hours in the last semester

The 60 credit MSW program encompasses two Distribution Requirements and four electives from the categories below. Distribution courses and electives are assigned to each cohort and informed by student interests. The following courses have historically been offered in the Intensive Weekend program:
