Registration Aid

Registration steps reminders:

- 1. Check programs Curriculum on the SSW Website
- 2. Observe schedule of courses for what is available on ALL CAMPUSES
- 3. Pay attention to course format as online courses will be either asynchronous **OR** synchronous. You will be able to differentiate by looking under "Meeting Times/Locations" for each section. Also, please be sure to review any section notes/comments for further information.

Asynchronous - Self-directed/By Arrangement under "Meeting Times/Locations" **Synchronous -** Specific day/time under "Meeting Times/Locations"

4. Go to Web Registration and choose your courses

Some reasons you may not be able to register for courses:

- For Financial holds
 - o Please visit the Student accounts website or check your Dashboard
- You are not eligible to take this course because you do not have the placement requirement or prerequisite
 - Ensure you have the prerequisite and if have further questions, please contact the Student Affairs office (studentaffairs@ssw.rutgers.edu)
- If you receive a message when trying to register and it says "Contact the Academic Dean"
 - o Please contact the Student Affairs office (studentaffairs@ssw.rutgers.edu)
- If you are trying to register for courses that are back to back on different campuses
 - o Please contact Student Affairs to be registered (<u>studentaffairs@ssw.rutgers.edu</u>)
- PAC (Personal Access Code) block *

* "PAC block" is when the student forgets their PAC number or if they have too many invalid entries and get locked out. The Registrar office (nb-help@registrar.rutgers.edu) needs to reset the students account to unlock the block.

Important things to keep in mind

- If you receive a message that a course is closed and a special permission number is needed, please keep in mind that The School of Social Work does not give these out. Do not contact the professor/instructor as they also cannot give out special permission numbers. If it is a course you are interested in, continue to check WebReg for an opening in the section.
- If you are registering for a practice course, please make sure you register for the Field Practicum as well. For example, (Social Work Practice I 19-910-500), (Field Education Practicum I 19-910-508).
- Please note: For students in the Traditional On-Campus program, if you anticipate taking Summer
 courses to help lighten your course load in the Fall and/or Spring semesters, please consider this may
