LOCATION

Offered on all three campuses: Newark, Camden and New Brunswick

APPLICATION DEADLINE

Fall: February 15

PROGRAM DURATION

Two-year, three-year, and four-year options; advanced standing, one-and two-year options

CERTIFICATES, SPECIAL PROGRAMS

Addiction Counselor Training, Aging and Health, Child and Adolescent Well-Being, Interpersonal Violence and Trauma, Latina/o/x Initiatives for Service, Training and Assessment certificates; Global programs

HOW ARE CLASSES OFFERED?

Students may take 6-15 credits per semester. Some online and hybrid course options are available, as well as winter and summer courses. All program requirements must be completed within four years.

PROGRAM-DEFINING FEATURES

Students are assigned academic advisors for support. Students have university-sized resources within a small-school setting.

PRACTICUM LEARNING

Generalist placement begins in the first semester with 15 hours per week. Specialized practicum placement requires 22.5 hours per week. Students enrolled in the part-time three- or four-year program begin the generalist placement in their second year.

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

Two-year (FT) or three-year (PT) options offered spring, summer and fall. Four semester Advanced Standing option (fall only).

CERTIFICATES, SPECIAL PROGRAMS

Interpersonal Violence and Trauma, Aging and Health, Latina/o/x Initiatives for Service, Training and Assessment certificates; Global programs

HOW ARE CLASSES OFFERED?

Students take two to four courses each semester. Classes are asynchronous with regularly scheduled assignments and due dates. Students and faculty interact in a robust technological learning environment.

PROGRAM-DEFINING FEATURES

Students are provided with an academic advisor and student support coach. Students move through the program as a cohort, developing a community of online peers. Online orientation is provided.

PRACTICUM LEARNING

Generalist placement begins in the first semester (2-yr students) or third semester and includes 11.25 hours per week for three semesters. Specialized placement begins in the second year and includes 13.5 hours per week four semesters.

PROGRAM DURATION

Three years (fall, spring, and summer)

PROGRAM-DEFINING FEATURES

This is an ideal option for students who are interested in online learning but also want an on-campus experience.

PRACTICUM LEARNING

Generalist placement begins in the third semester and includes 11.25 hours per week for three semesters. Specialized placement begins in the second year and includes 13.5 hours per week four semesters.

Offered off-campus in Bordentown, Jersey City, Mays Landing, and New Brunswick

APPLICATION DEADLINE

Fall: February 15

PROGRAM DURATION

Just under three years (eight semesters); the Advanced Standing program is just under two years (five semesters).

CERTIFICATES, SPECIAL PROGRAMS

Global programs

HOW ARE CLASSES OFFERED?

Students take two courses each semester (fall, spring, and summer) and attend one full weekend of in-person class each month. Students also participate in synchronous and asynchronous online activities to support learning.

PROGRAM-DEFINING FEATURES

Students take courses as a cohort and typically form a close supportive group. Cohort members learn from each other's experience as they apply course content to their work and practicum settings. Regular advisor support is provided in-person, virtually, and via email and phone as needed. New students are provided with a multi-year calendar so they can plan for full attendance. Students provide input around cohort course selection.

PRACTICUM LEARNING

Practicum learning begins in the first semester and continues for the duration of the degree program. Students devote 8-10 hours per week during the first year and 10-12 hours weekly in the second and third years. Most placements are workplace-based in a different department from the student's customary employment responsibilities and supervised by an MSW. Students may complete their placement in a single setting, provided it offers progressively challenging opportunities for growth.
